

DANCE

As a Dance major it might be difficult to study abroad and still take the studio courses required for your major. However, there are several host institutions that allow you to fulfill studio requirements and experience the cultural diversity of studying in Britain, Ireland, or South Africa. If you are studying dance, you will be able to learn familiar topics from a different perspective through both traditional dance courses and courses unique to your host country's experience. BRITAIN

Goldsmiths, University of London

DT50001A Improvisation and Imagery in Dance Movement Therapy

This practical course introduces you to working through group process with movement improvisation and imagery. You are encouraged to explore the links between sensation, imagery, movement, and self-expression. You keep a written and visual journal, and create a movement presentation with an accompanying narrative. You attend for two hours each week.

IRELAND

MD4052 Native Music and Dance Traditions of Ireland

The early history of Irish dance reveals a constant shifting of population through migration and invasions. This course will discuss this trend in regards to traditional music and dance.

This is an introductory level course covering the fundamental principles of African dance and music. It is located in Intsika: an open-ended Pan African dance technique that developed by Maxwell Xolani Rani since 2002. The technique draws from key movements from all over the African continent as well as the diaspora.
