GM3080 Grammatical rules and lexical exceptions in modern German Grammatical rules and lexical exceptions in modern German are considered against the background of Saussurean structuralism and in relation to language teaching.. Saussure said that a language is a system, and languages do indeed have rules, in their grammar. But most rules of grammar have a long list of unexplained exceptions - why? The view taken in this module is that unexplained exceptions indicate that the grammarians have got the rule wrong. We look at two rules of modern German to see how a close examination of their unexplained exceptions can point to a new and better rule: the passive and non-passivizable transitive verbs; and tense formation and strong verbs.
